

Draught Beers

Beer lovers will appreciate our effort to provide an authentic Irish beer drinking experience.

Beer is thought to be the world's oldest and most widely consumed alcoholic beverage and the third most popular drink overall after water and tea. It is produced by the brewing and fermentation of starches, mainly derived from cereal grains—the most common of which is malted barley, although wheat, maize (corn), and rice are widely used. Most beer is flavored with hops, which add bitterness and act as a natural preservative, though other flavorings such as herbs or fruit may occasionally be included.

STOUT \$4.50 pint

Stout (or Porter) is a style of dark ale made using roasted malts or barley, and brewed with top-fermenting ale yeast. Dark, rich and frothy, stouts are the grandparents of all beers.

Examples: Guinness, Murphy's

ALE \$4.50 pint

Ale is a type of beer brewed from malted barley using a top-fermenting brewers' yeast. This yeast ferments the beer quickly, giving it a sweet, full bodied and fruity taste. Most ales contain hops, which impart a bitter herbal flavour that helps to balance the sweetness of the malt and preserve the beer.

Examples: Smithwick's, Murphy's Red, Newcastle

LAGER \$4.50 pint

Lager is the English name for cool fermenting beers of Central European origin. Pale lagers are the most commonly consumed beers in the world. Modern pilsners are a form of lager beer. (The Lager family includes the Pilsners or Weizenbiers.)

Example: Harp, Stella Artois, Budweiser

CIDER \$5.00 pint (When available)

Cider is made from the fermented juice of apples, although ciders made from other fruits are gaining in popularity. They can be classified in the first instance from dry to sweet, and the flavor of different ciders varies enormously. The variations in clarity and color are mostly due to filtering between pressing and fermentation.

Examples: Strongbow, Woodchuck

Irish Whiskey "Uisce Beatha" = Water of Life

Bushmills

The Old Bushmills Distillery, located in the town of Bushmills, County Antrim, Northern Ireland, has been producing whiskey, under a license issued by King James I, since 1608, and claims to have done so for at least 400 years prior to that time.

Jameson

The Jameson distilling tradition, established at Dublin's Bow Street Distillery, in 1780, has always insisted upon producing every component of their whiskey as, they say, "from grain to glass." The most famous component in Jameson is the legendary "Pure Pot Still" component unique to Irish whiskey distilling since the origins of whiskey in Ireland around 600 A.D. Today, Jameson is distilled in Cork city, in southern Ireland.

Tullamore Dew

Tullamore Dew is a blended Irish whiskey. It was first distilled in 1829 in the small town of Tullamore, County Offaly, Ireland. Contrary to popular belief, the name derives from the initials of an early owner, Daniel E. Williams - D.E.W. Tullamore Dew is the number two Irish whiskey brand in the world.
